

## **ADMISSION ADDENDUM FOR FORENSIC SCIENCE STUDENTS**

Bay Path College is one of a select group of institutions that is offering a Bachelor of Science in Forensic Science and a Bachelor of Science in Biology. One of the reasons so few institutions offer the degree in the four year format is the number and level of degree of difficulty of courses, especially in the areas on science and math. Students accepted into the Forensic Science program at Bay Path College are in for an exciting, challenging and rigorous academic experience, and should understand the following about the program:

- 1.) All students accepted into the program are accepted *Conditionally*. This means that students must maintain a CGPA of 2.7 or better by the end of the typical “Freshman Year”, and must take and complete all of the “Freshman Year” courses outlined on the attached degree audit. Students with a CGPA of below 2.7 will not be allowed to take the upper level science courses offered after freshman year.
- 2.) Students who are earning a CGPA of 3.0 or higher by the end of the “Sophomore Year” (as outlined on the attached audit), will earn *Advanced Standing* in the Forensic Science program.
- 3.) The Forensic Science Degree is a “lock-step” program, meaning that courses are offered in a particular sequence. Students must take courses in the sequence outlined on the attached document in order to complete the degree in four years.
- 4.) Students who do not test into college level English or algebra may be required to take additional preparatory courses to build their skills before being allowed to take required courses. This may mean taking courses over the summer or possibly taking longer than 4 academic years to complete the degree.
- 5.) The program is rigorous and requires students to devote a significant amount of time to studying and class preparation.
- 6.) - 7.) Students who are unable to meet minimum qualifications to complete the degree, or who change their interests, are encouraged to explore and pursue related programs in Biology, Biotechnology, Criminal Justice, Forensic Psychology or Legal Studies, and/or other Bay Path College programs, such as Business, Liberal Studies, Psychology or Occupational Therapy.
- 8.) It is important that you let a representative of the College know if you are struggling or need guidance so we can help advise you about your next steps.
