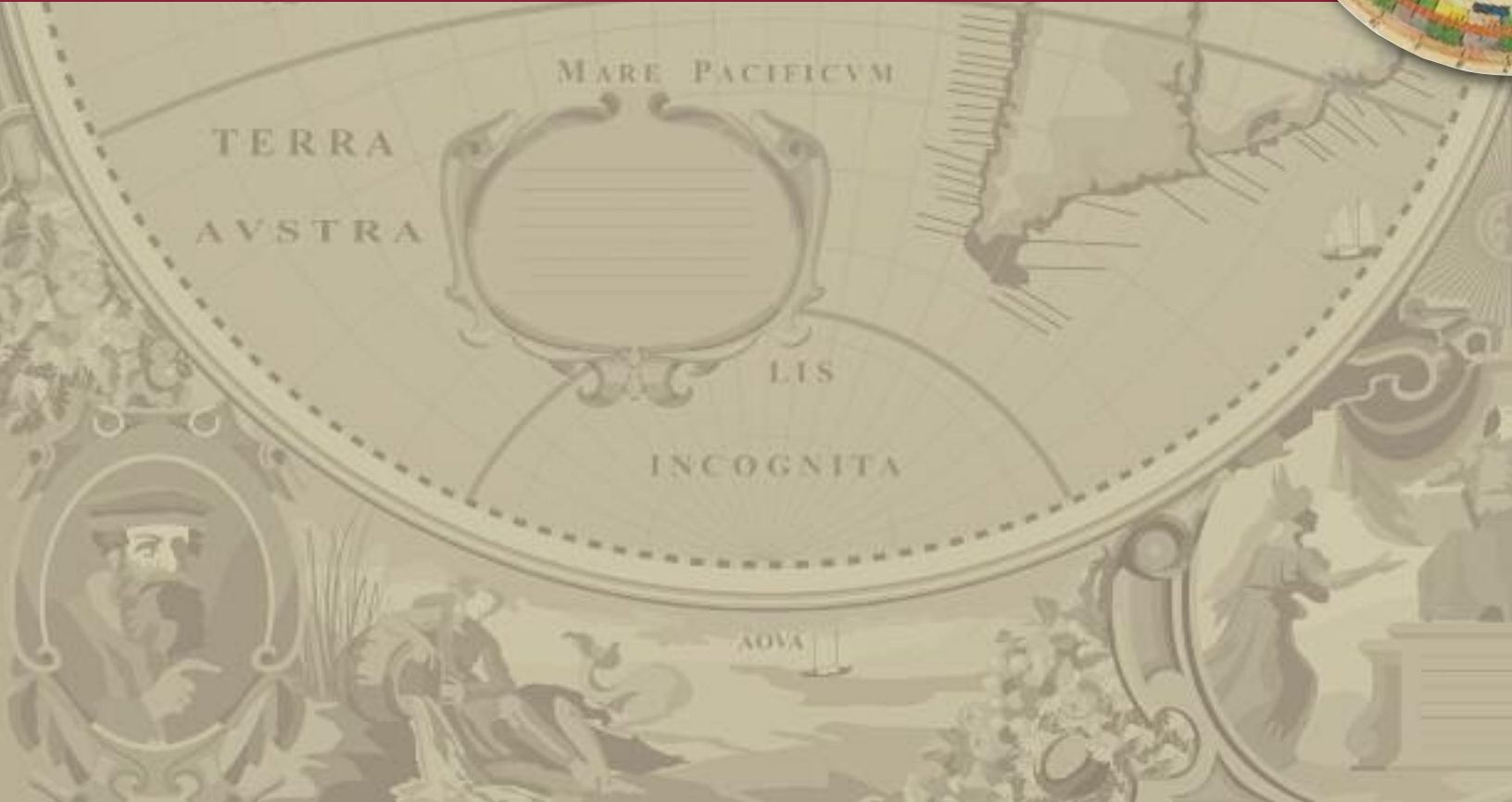




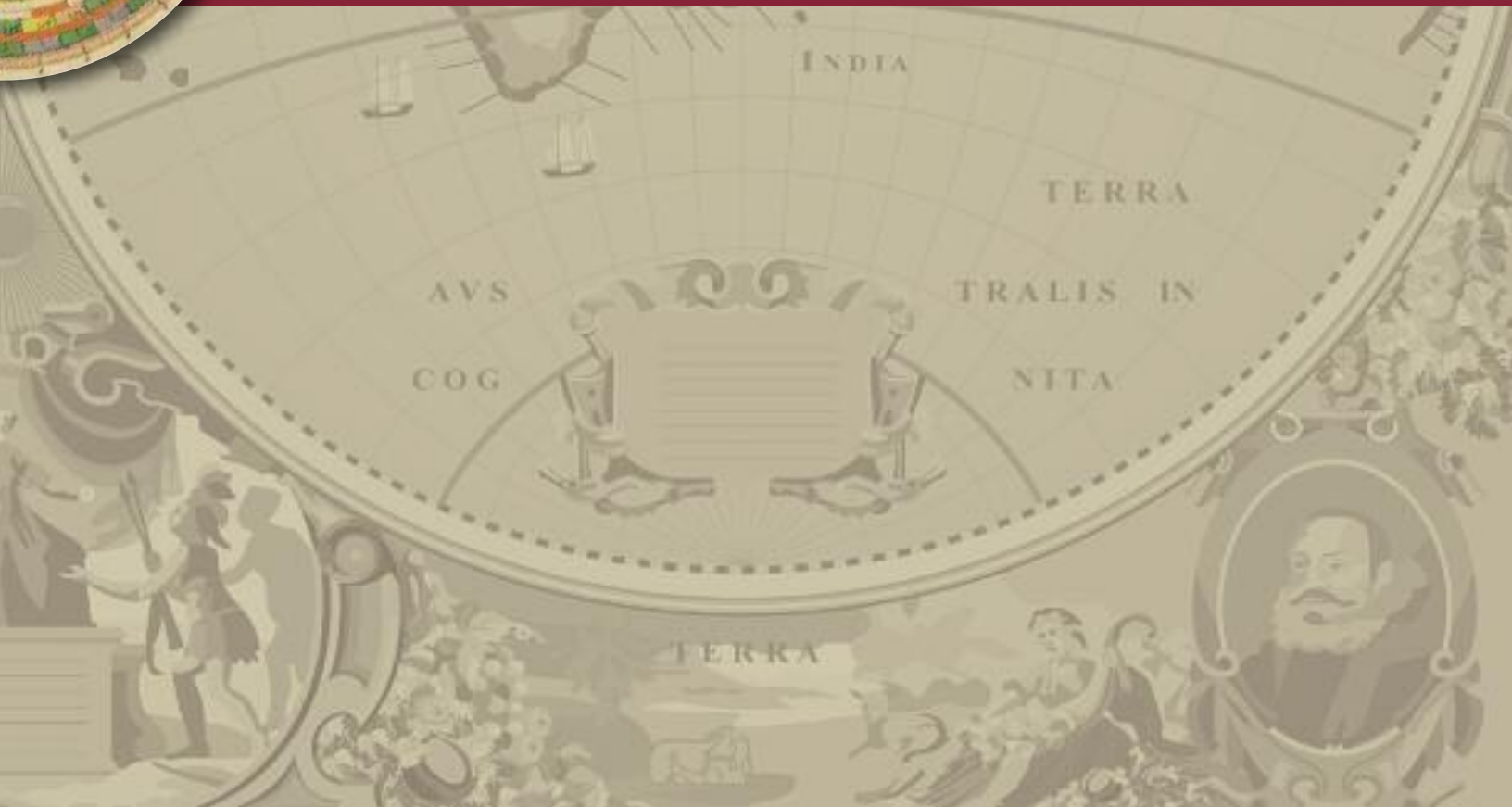

Three years ago we set out to help Bay Path students chart new paths through an historic campaign focused on *Access, Academics, and Achievement*. To be sure, it wasn't the easiest time to launch a fundraising effort and we admit to some apprehension regarding the impact that the economic downturn would have on our goal. But what we quickly and clearly came to understand is that the economy is no match for the passion that people share for Bay Path students. Recognizing that the students we serve are often the most vulnerable among us, College Trustees, alumni, friends, faculty and staff opened their hearts and gave generously. What originally began as a \$6 million goal grew to \$9 million, then to \$15 million. We are profoundly grateful and honored to report that the *Charting New Paths* Campaign concluded with a grand total of **\$16,583,365!**

This accomplishment is attributable to the determination of our Campaign Steering Committee: honorary co-chairs John and Robyn Davis, and members Roberta Bolduc, Barbara Sadowsky, Ruth McLoughlin Vignati '62 and Roberta Campbell Wilson '62. We thank them for their guidance and great optimism. We extend deepest appreciation to each and every donor – your generosity has ignited flames of learning and the promise of lives transformed. Finally, we are thankful for Bay Path students themselves. Their stories inspire us, their hard work humbles us, and their spirits reinforce our steadfast belief in the power of education and the mission of Bay Path College.
